The Program:

The International MA Program in Child Development was established with the goal of improving the lives of children around the world. It is designed to prepare the next generation of international experts who will focus on pressing questions regarding the nature of child development and how it applies to the lives of children and their families in the developing world. This unique program equips professionals with the knowledge and skills that are necessary when returning to their home countries to affect and influence the well-being of children and their families.

Admission Requirements:

- Accredited BA in relevant academic disciplines related to social services for children: social work, occupational therapy, speech and language pathology, physical therapy, medicine, nursing, early childhood education, psychology and law.
- Copy of diploma and transcript.
- ◆ A minimum of 3.0 GPA, 80% or equivalent.
- ◆ At least three years of experience working with children and families. Preference will be given to individuals who already demonstrate experience in leadership positions in their respective fields.
- ◆ English test scores might be required if native language is not English or candidates have not previously studied at an institution of higher education where the language of instruction is English. In such events we will consider each candidate on an individual basis, also based on further evidence attesting to mastery of the English language.
- ◆ Three letters of recommendation from university faculty members and/or senior professionals in the field.
- ◆ Statement of Purpose (500 words).
- Personal History Statement (500 words).

- Copy of valid passport.
- Medical forms.
