

Single Sign-On (SSO) Guide for Students

One Identification, One Password for University Systems

The Single Sign-On (SSO) system consolidates access to multiple university platforms for current students and accepted applicants, including:

- **Tuition Payments:** Online credit card payments for tuition deposits (students and applicants).
- **Moodle E-Learning:** Access to online course materials, assignments, and activities.
- **Library Services:** Course reserve readings, scans, personal loans, reservations, and academic databases.
- **Student Portal:** Class schedules, official certificates, grades, and administrative services.
- **Online Software Store:** Access to software purchases and downloads.
- **Special Exam Date Request Form:** Submitting requests for extraordinary exam dates (Moed Charig).
- **K2 Form System:** Submitting applications for dorms, special scholarships, and administrative requests.
- **University Mobile App:** Official mobile application for student services.

Note for New Applicants & Accepted Students:

If you are accessing university applications via SSO for the first time, you must create a new password independently before logging in.

1. Steps for Logging into the SSO System

The system uses Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) for enhanced security. Please follow these steps:

Step 1: Primary Login

Enter your 9-digit Israeli ID number, or, if you are an international student, the student number you received during registration (it begins with 9), along with your password.

- First-time users: You can set up your password using the SSO Password Reset System.

Step 2: Verification (Two-Factor Authentication)

Choose one of the following methods to complete the login process:

- **Method A: Email Verification** — Select the email option. A verification code will be sent to your registered university email. Enter the code in the prompt field and click "Check Code" (בדוק קוד).
- **Method B: Authenticator App** — Set up and use an Authenticator App on your smartphone for secondary verification.

2. Setting, Changing, or Resetting Your Password

If you experience login issues or wish to change your password, use the SSO Unified Password Reset System.

Important: Changing your password here will update your password across ALL university systems listed above.

To reset your password, verify your identity using the mobile phone number or email address registered in the university system.
